## Athletes by Gender

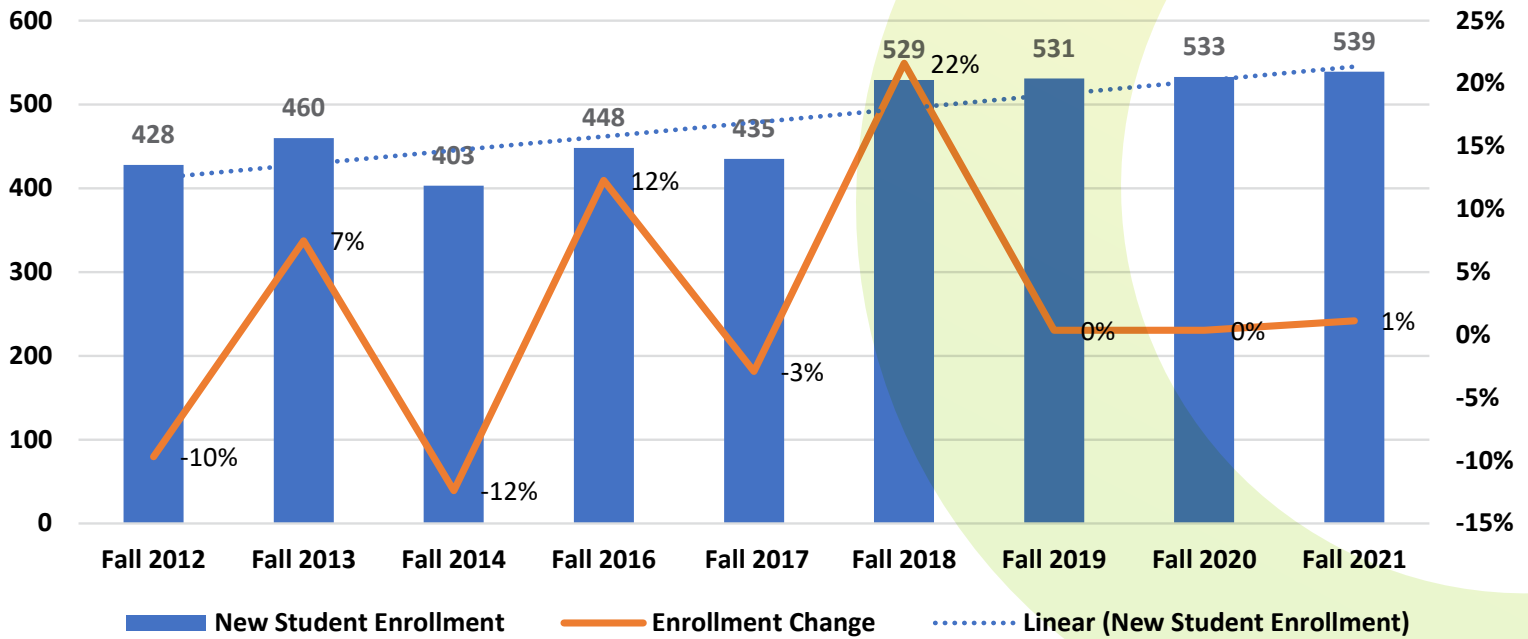

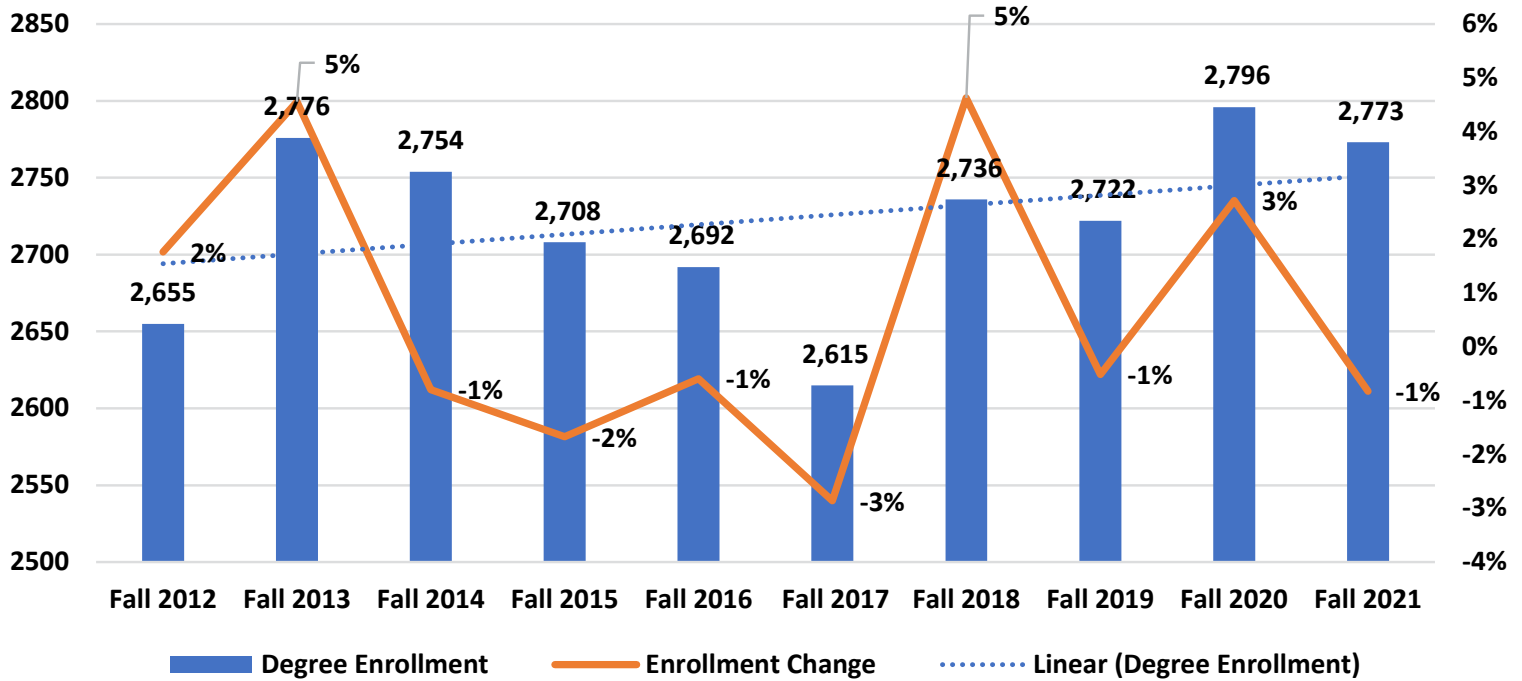

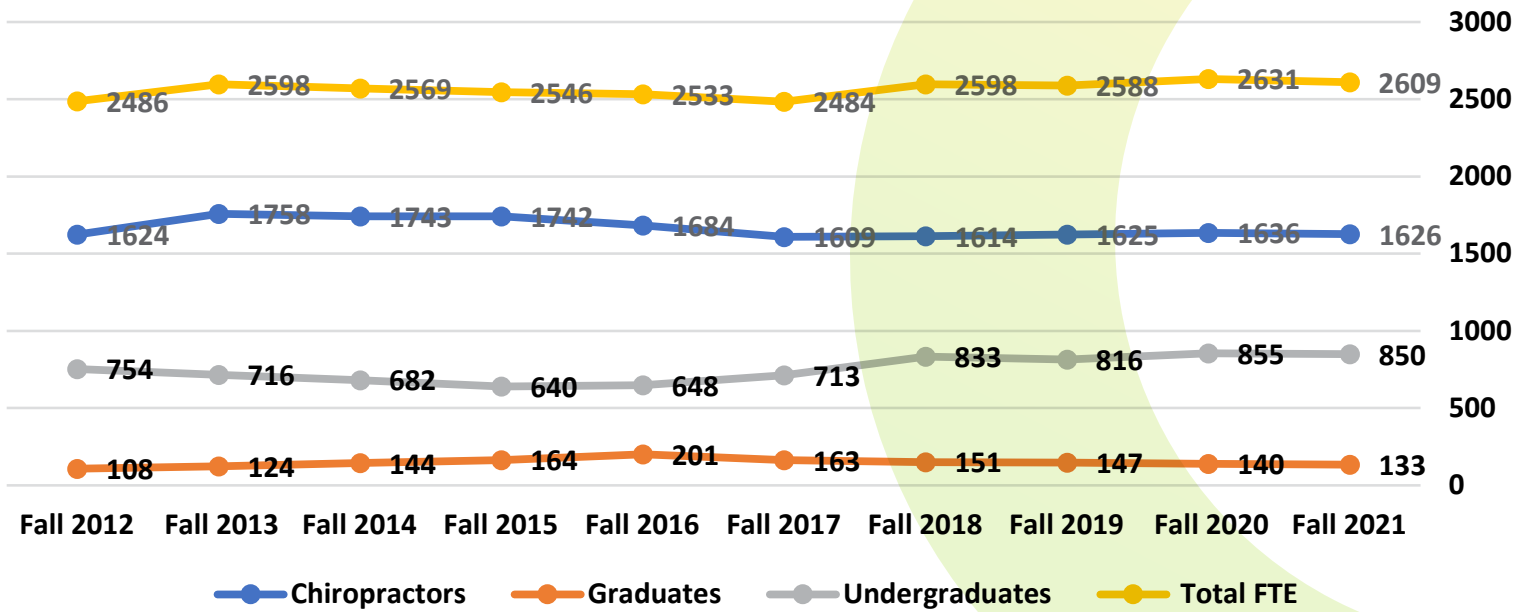

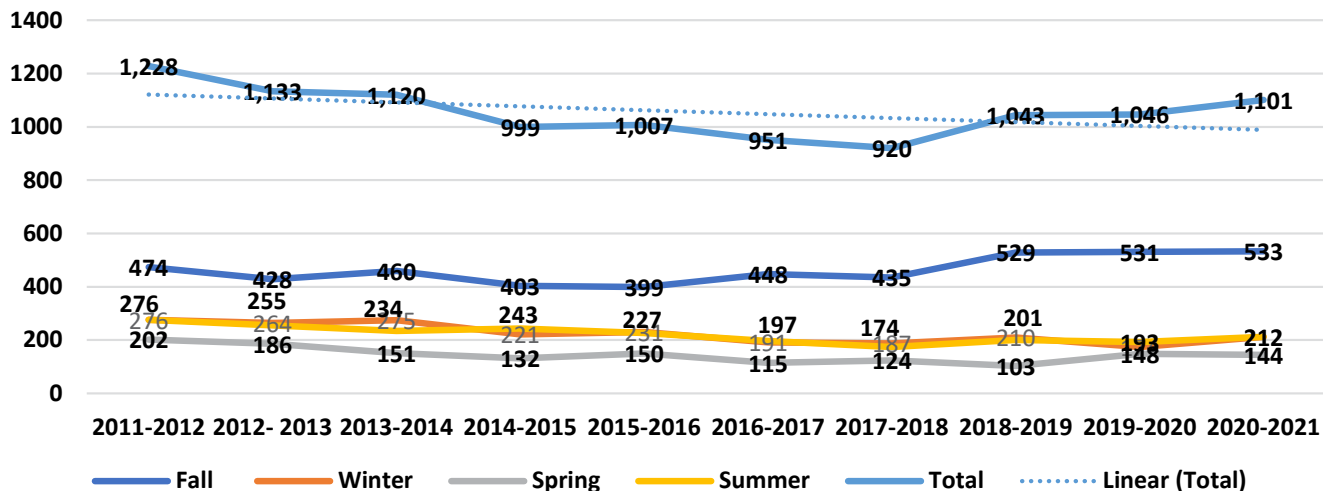

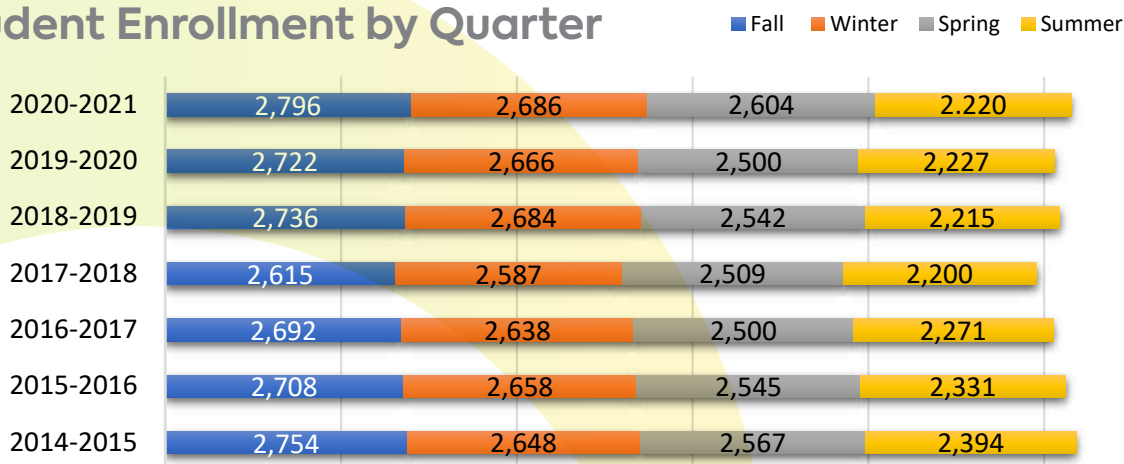

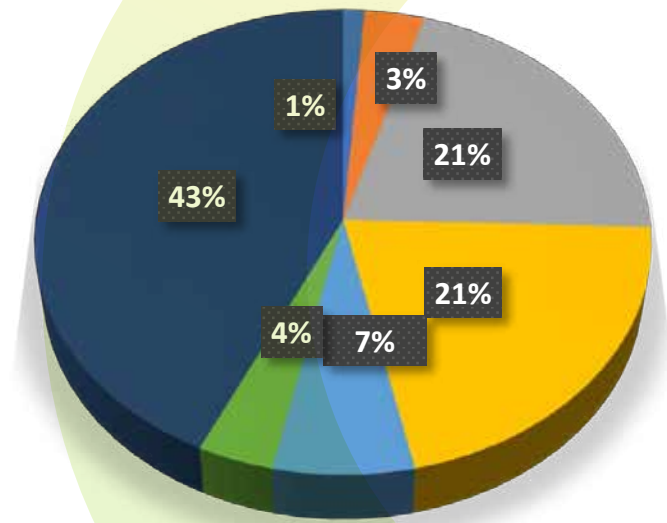

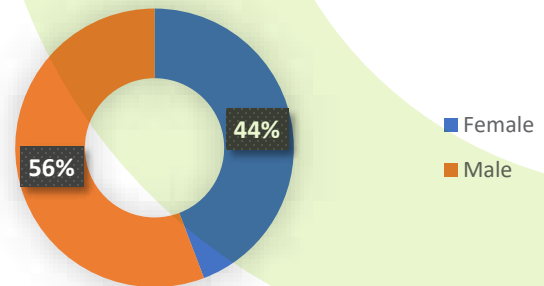

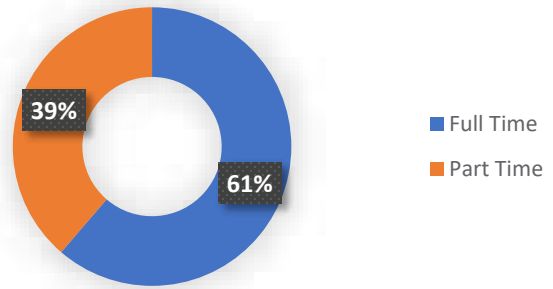
### Faculty by Gender

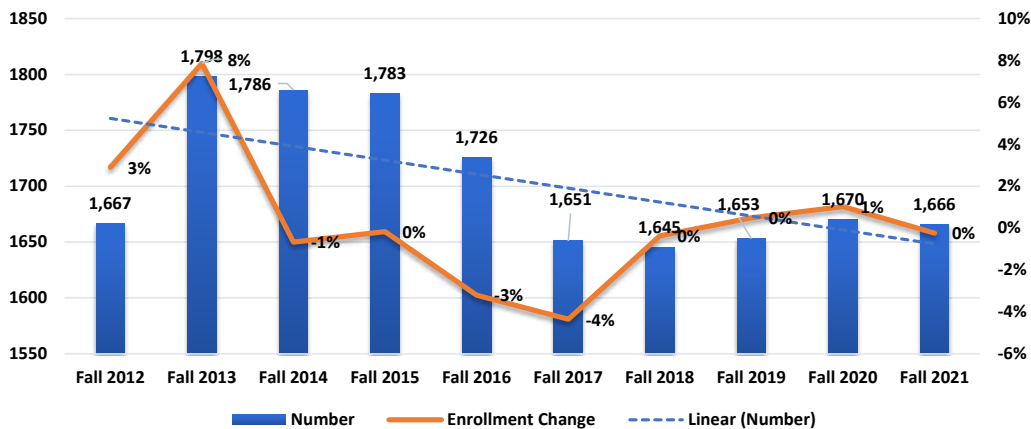

### COC Enrollment Trend



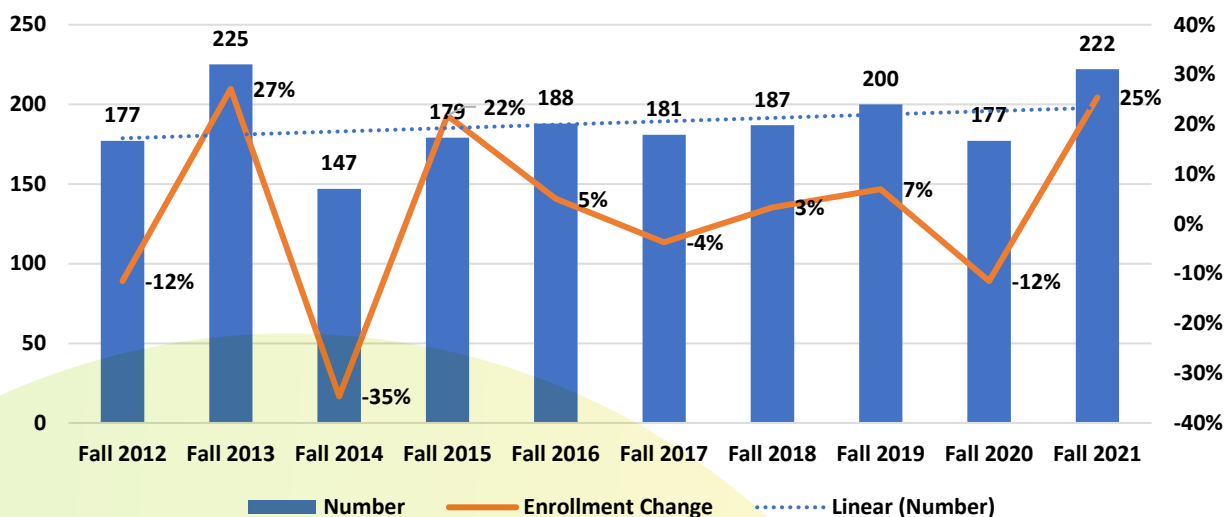
