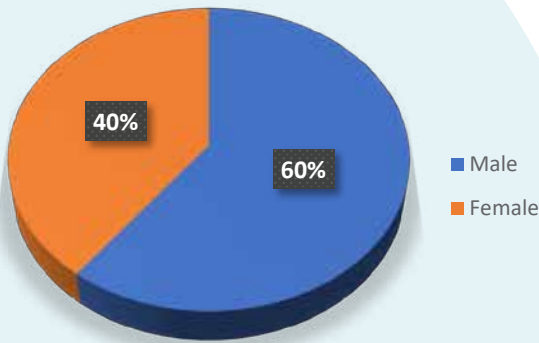

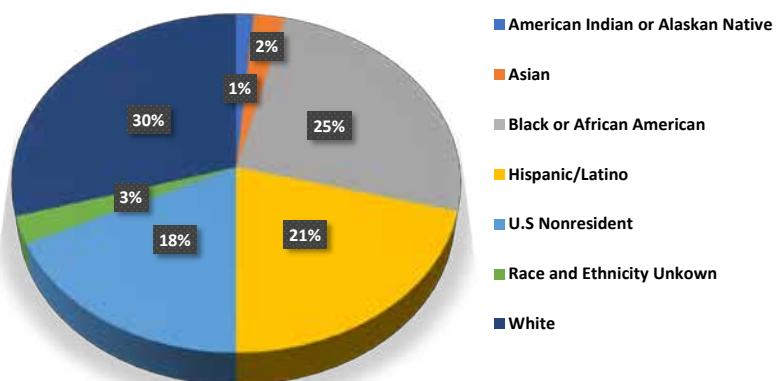
Sports by Race

Athletes by Gender



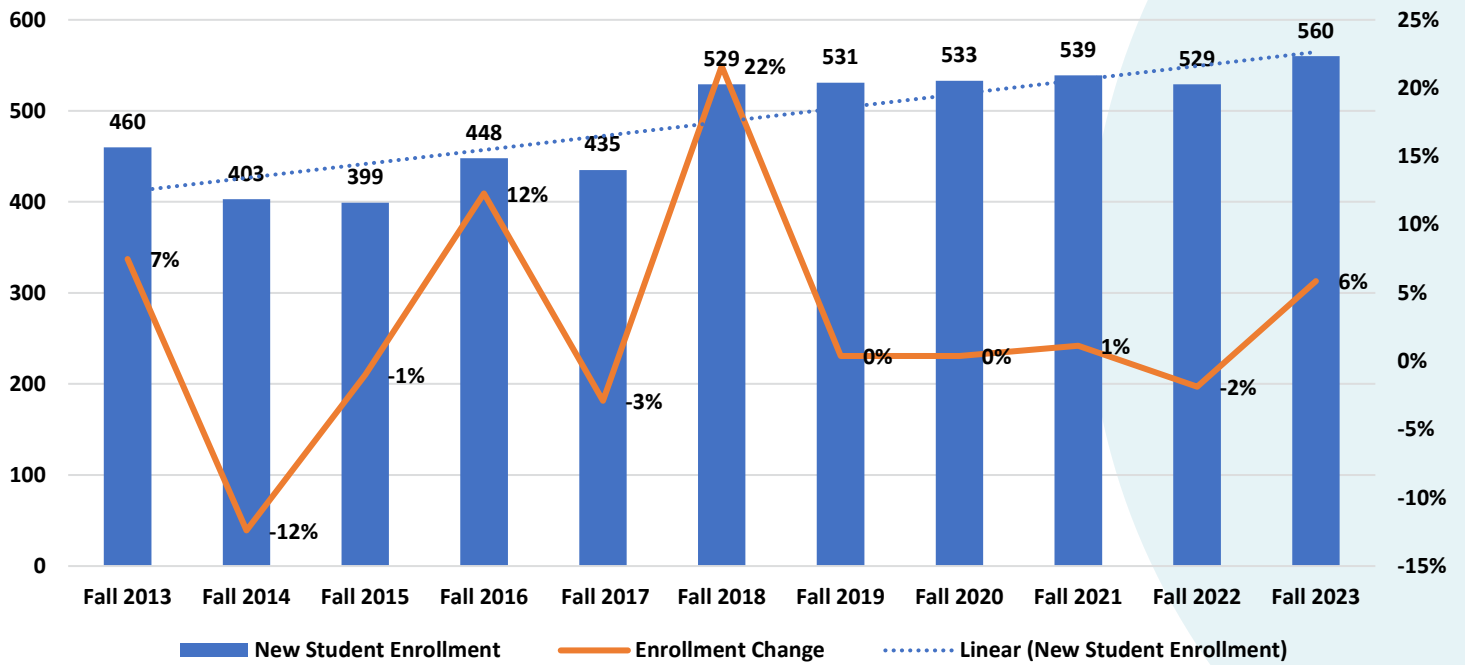

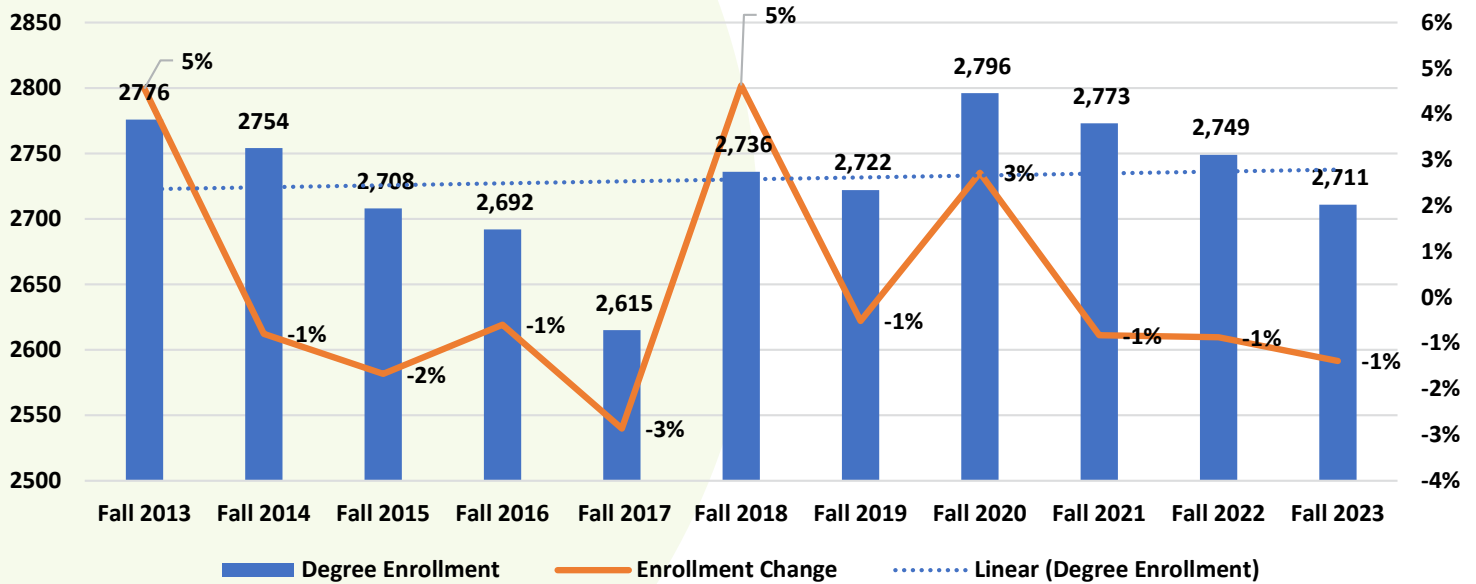

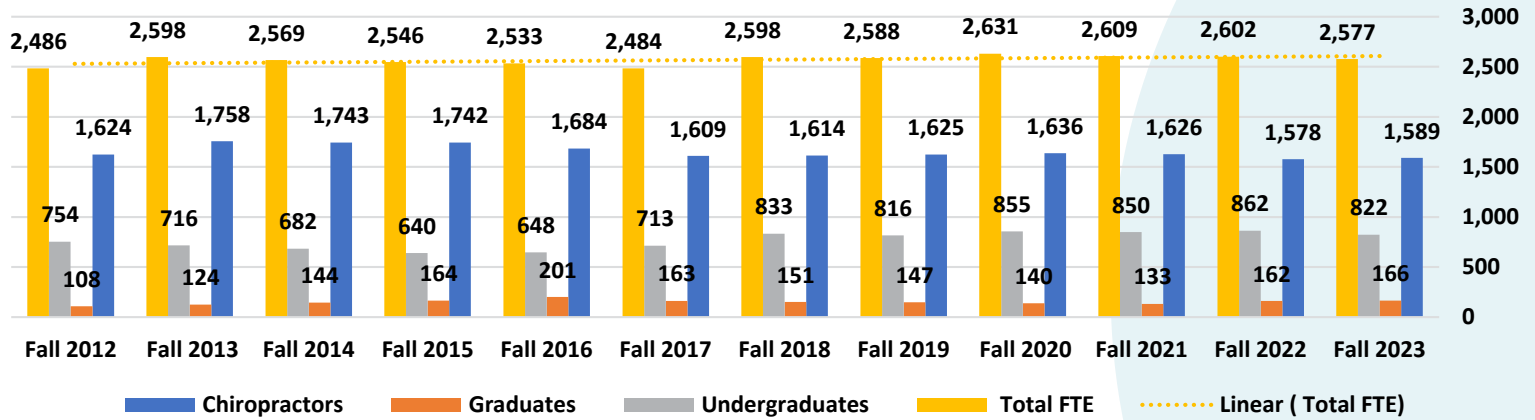

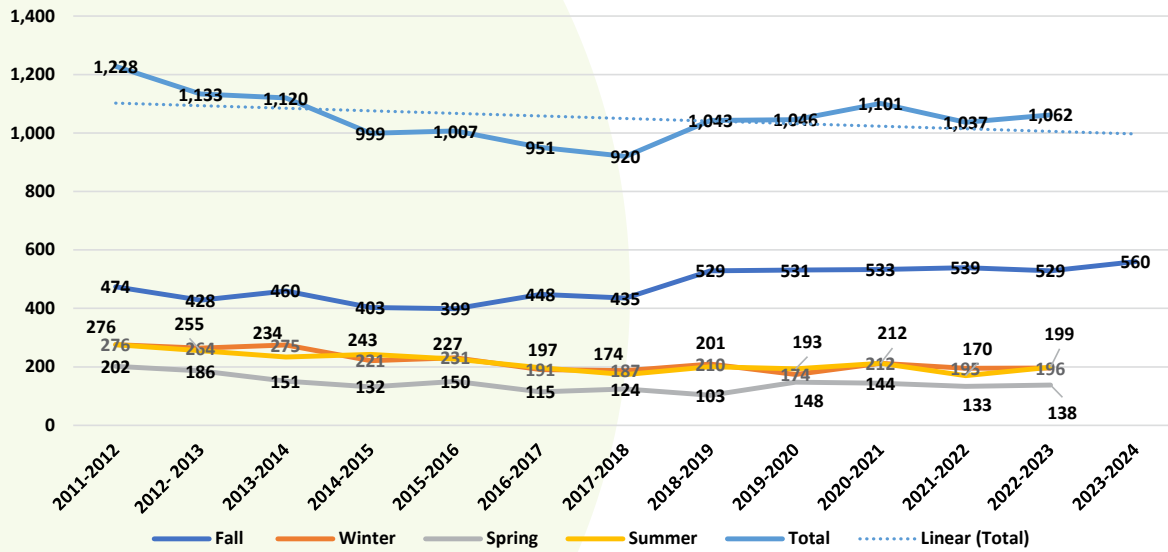

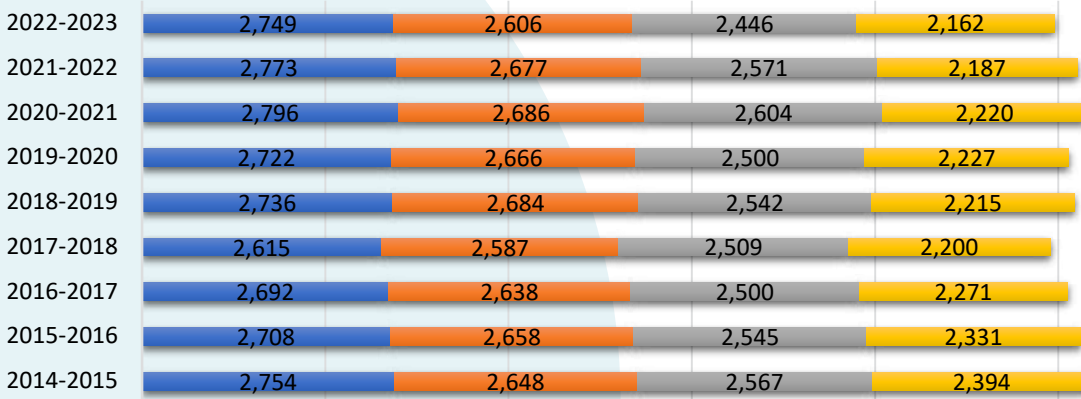

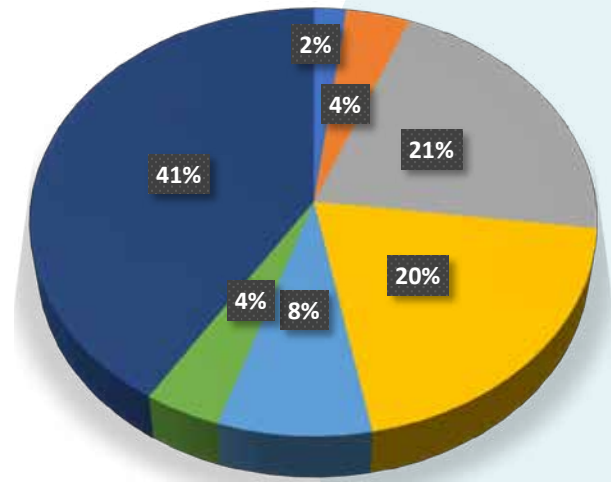

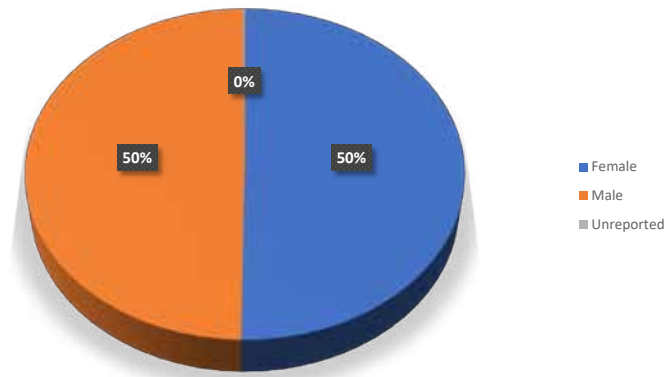

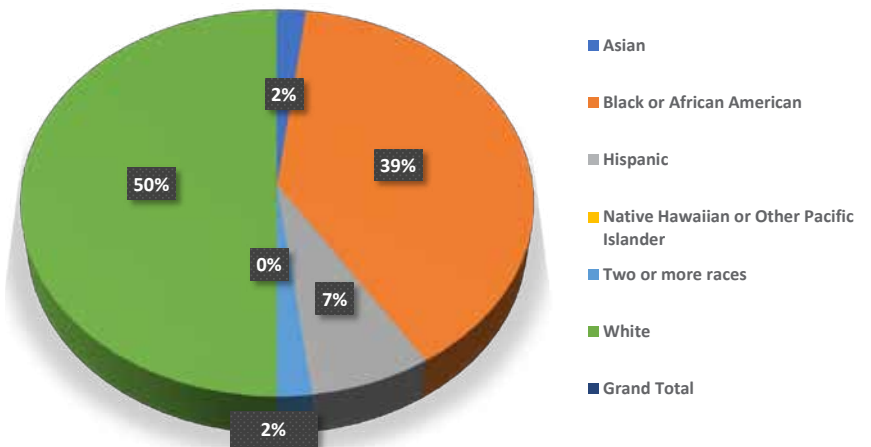

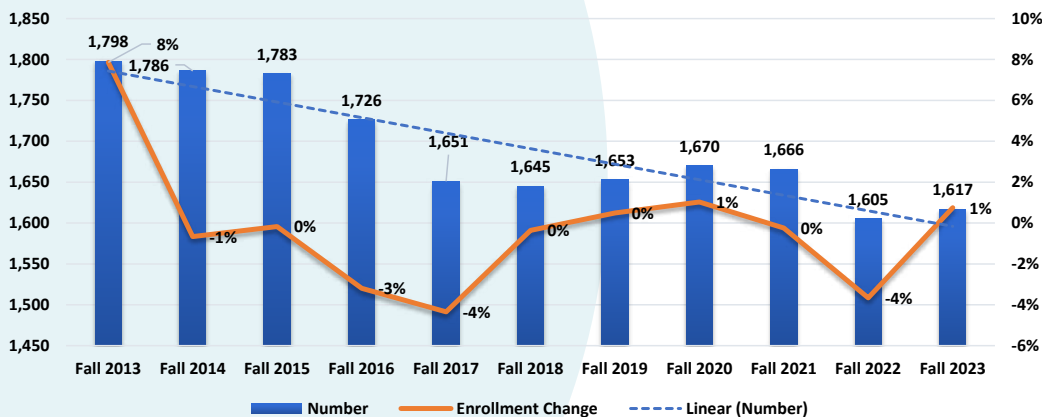
Enrollment by Quarter

COC Enrollment Trend



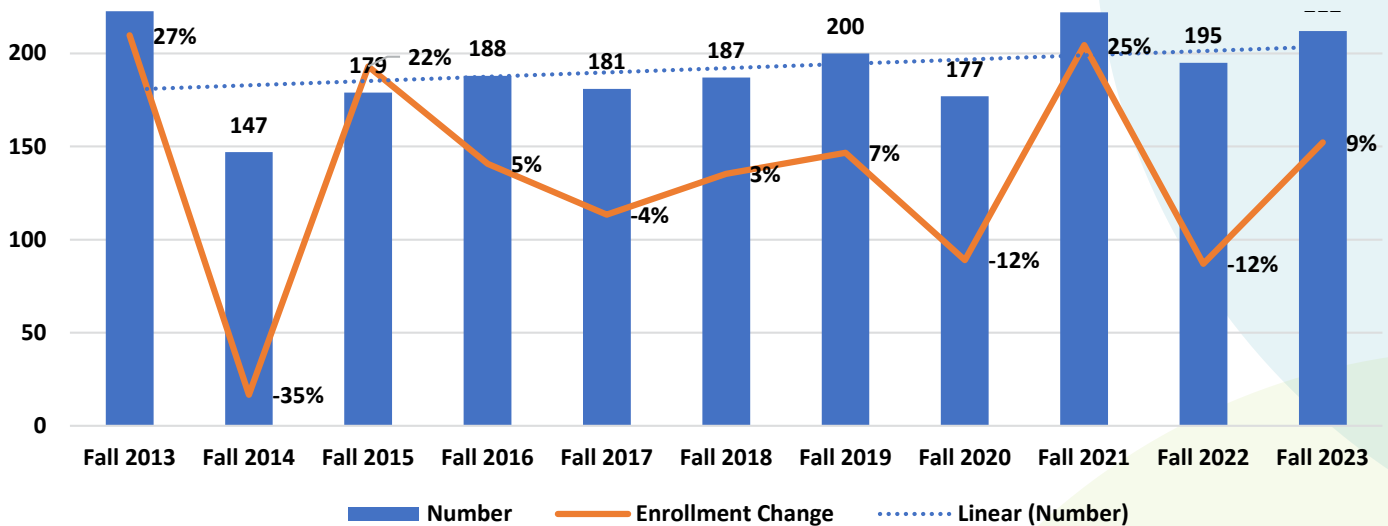

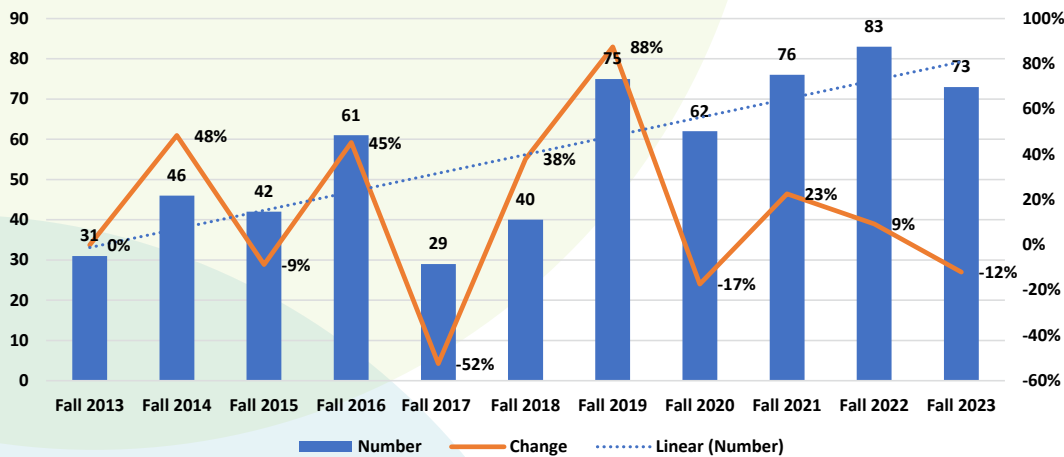

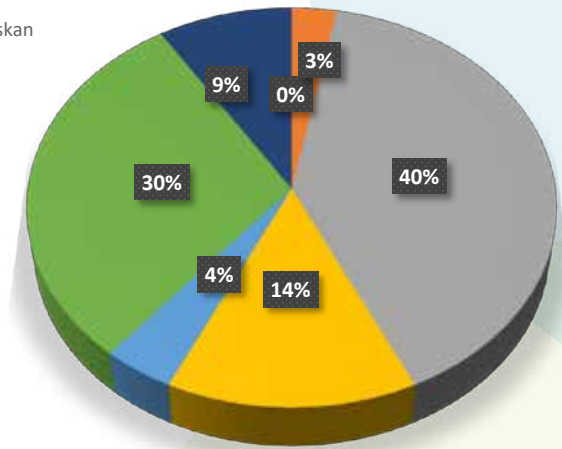

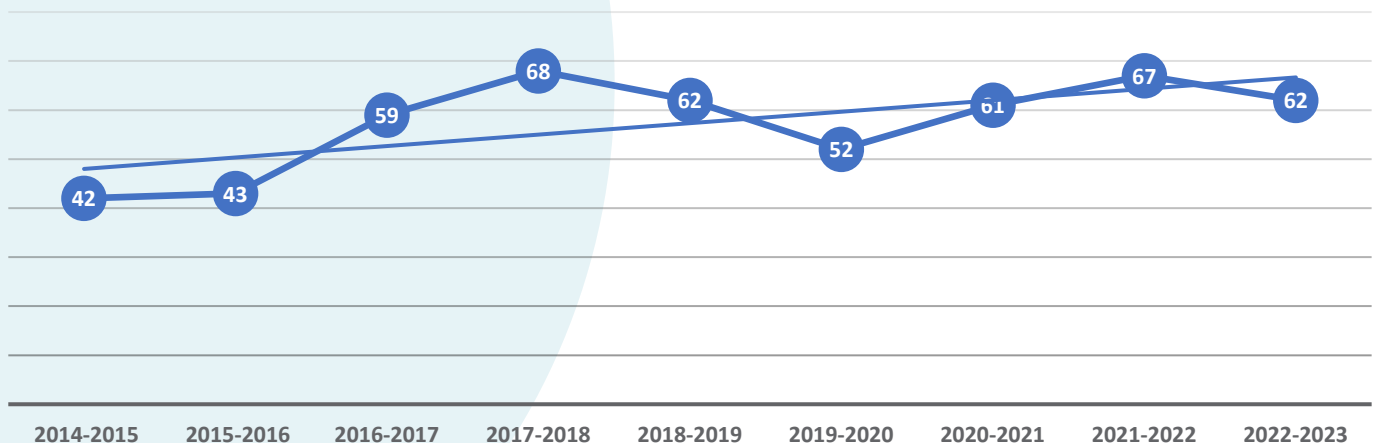

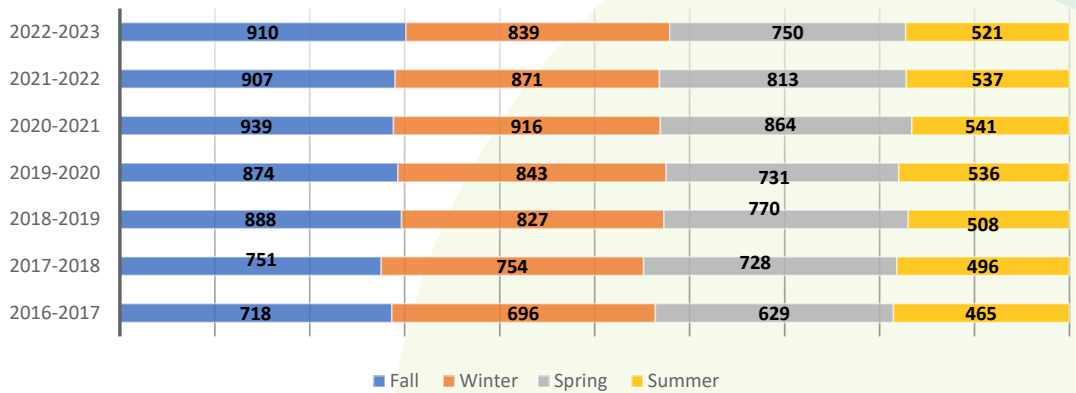
